There are several showcases of miniature pianos and cars, memorabilia from his childhood to present day, along with many gifts and artifacts given to Liberace from fans and dignitaries from all over the world. Guests are delighted at the close-up look of the legendary million-dollar wardrobe from the world of "Mr. Showmanship". After a short bus ride, guests visit the museum that is fit for a King...The Elvis-A-Rama Museum. From the giant gold record and neon guitar anchored on the rooftop, to the \$3.5 million dollars worth of Cadillac's, clothes, records, posters and memorabilia inside, this collection will knock your socks off! "Elvis-A-Rama" originally an 80-foot mural project commissioned soon after Presley's death in 1977, was on display in Nashville for nearly 20 years and now graces the entrance to the museum. Hoover Dam, without precedent the greatest construction of its day, is today still viewed in awe and acclaimed as one of the seven man-made wonders of the world. Truly a magnificent monument to man's vision and creativity and a must see for even the frequent traveler. The dam was completed in 1936 forming the world's largest man-made reservoir, Lake Mead. Officially named Hoover Dam in 1947 after President Herbert Hoover, it stretches 1,244 feet across the Colorado River and rises 44 stories above the river bottom. Visitors are given more information about the dam than ever before through a series of presentations offered by professional guides stationed at various locations around the dam site. Cameras!
