Heard Museum and Botanical Garden	Thurs., March 29	1 to 5 p.m.	_____	\$59 per person
<i>This tour combines two of the Valley's most unique and interesting visitor attractions. The Desert Botanical Garden is the only botanical garden dedicated entirely to the study of desert plant life. Its display of over 15,000 desert plants is one of the finest in the world. Located in beautiful Papago Park, the garden draws over 100,000 people each year. The internationally acclaimed Heard Museum is one of the best places to experience and learn about the fascinating cultures and art of Native Americans of the Southwest. It was founded in 1929 by Dwight B. and Maie Bartlett Heard to house their personal collection of Native American artifacts. Minimum number of guests: 12.</i>				
Horse Back Riding at the Sheraton	Fri., March 30	1 to 4 p.m.	_____	\$89 per person
<i>Slow your pace and take in the Southwestern scenery on horseback on the grounds of the Sheraton Wild Horse Pass. This tour begins at the Koli Equestrian Center and takes you back in time to the wilder West of days past. You'll see the Gila River Indian Community the way early settlers did, from the vantage point of a gentle, sure-footed horse. This adventure, complete with a private wrangler, lasts an hour and a half—a perfect jaunt for the casual rider. From the saddle, you'll see the lands that shaped the culture of the Pima and Maricopa Native Americans. These sunny desert vistas and painted landscapes will charm you, and the steady stride of your horse will lull you in to sweet escape from the everyday. The Sierra Estrella and South Mountains rise magnificently in the background, and straight ahead you'll meander past unique plant life and, perhaps, the occasional hummingbird or jack rabbit that calls the Sonoran desert home. Frank Lloyd Wright Taliesin West	Sat., March 31	1 to 5 p.m.	_____	\$79 per person
<i>The dramatic Taliesin West living room (called the Garden Room by Wright) and the newly refurbished living quarters wing are the highlights of this tour. You'll also enjoy all the elements of the Panorama tour, which includes a visit to the Cabaret Cinema, Music Pavilion, Seminar Theater and Wright's private office—all linked by dramatic terraces, gardens, and walkways overlooking the rugged Sonoran desert and valley below. Guides explain how the architecture relates to the desert and provide a general overview of Wright's basic theories of design. The Garden Room is entered through a typically Wrightian low-ceiling, stone-wall space, which opens to a dramatic 56-foot-long by 34-foot-wide room, linked to the garden by expansive windows.
